When my friend (translator) and I arrived to the check point just outside of Juarez, we were stopped and questioned. The officer asked where we were going. My friend responds to tell him that we were going to preach in a small church just 15 minutes away. The officer says that I cannot preach. I was just about to respond and say that I could not agree to that, when the officer told us to continue on. We went on to the church and ministered. During the service a drunken man comes in. He is a distraction the whole service, but praise God he responds to the message and comes forward to receive Jesus. I asked God to sober him so that he would not be controlled by the alcohol. Sure enough, God did sober him. He was crying and praying at the altar for quite some time.

When we were about to leave, he came to me and asked if we could give him a ride to Juarez and drop him off at a Christian rehab. We took him as he requested and left him at the rehab. The Pastor told us that he had never been to his church, but he would go to visit him in the rehab.

Then a few weeks later, I went to preach for an evangelistic crusade. The same thing happens; a drunken man comes into the service and becomes a distraction. That did not distract the presence of God. God continued to move and touch people and even the drunken man falls to his knees and cries out to God.

Finally the next day, I preached and ministered in a small Assembly of God church. When I finished the message, I just simply said that the altars were open if anyone wanted to come up. The people immediately filled the altar and fell to their knees and began to weep and cry. God moved mightily on the people. What I didn't know was that during the service, someone broke into the Suburban and stole my battery. When I climbed into the Suburban immediately I knew that someone had been in it. I looked around to see if anything was missing. Nothing was gone, but when I tried to start the Suburban nothing happened. I opened the hood to

The devil was mad and tried to upset me, but God says I am going to give you a new battery to replace the old one. I was humbled and blessed in that moment. Our God is an awesome God! Through these oppositions and distractions, God moved and souls were saved and lives transformed. To God be the glory!
