The church in the center of Bari is taking shape and the Christian bookstore it sponsors was recently inaugurated. In addition, the building is also open to Nigerian and Brazilian congregations who meet on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings, respectively.



In March, Denise helped the women organize a National Women's Day dinner, which was catered and sponsored by our Corato church. She did her best to delegate each area to the younger women: special music, games and decorations while concentrating on giving an evangelistic message. About 80 women attended, over 20 as first-time guests. As we mentioned in a previous newsletter, Pina, who is prayerfully battling uterine cancer, not only invited a woman she met in the supermarket, but also gave a powerful testimony. In fact, she was so inspired that she took off her head scarf during her presentation and has not worn it since. In May, she had a life-threatening reaction to oral chemo treatments and we almost lost her but, the Lord sustained her once again and her medication dose was readjusted to where she is almost back to normal.
