Most churches usually have a spring-cleaning workday, but this year ours lasted an entire week. In August of 2017, we left our former building and temporarily rented a conference room close by. We were in negotiation towards renting a vacated **dining hall** belonging to a local hotel for several months and were hoping to sign a contract by this summer, when all of a sudden it was made available on May 1st. We had only six days to clean an enormous dining room, bathrooms, industrial sized kitchen, two marble staircases and wall-to-wall windows before our first service. He has also asked for a Bible in English, so please pray for him as we do have a home group close to his house that he could easily plug into when we start up again in September.
